Situation Overview


Tropical Storm Harvey



- T.S. Harvey will move back over the Gulf of Mexico today, but will remain east of the Port O'Connor area. Northwesterly wind gusts 30 to 40 mph will still be possible across the Coastal Bend today.
- Tropical Storm Warning remains in effect from Mesquite Bay to High Island.
- The heavy rainfall threat has decreased markedly and shifted east. Localized accumulations of 2 to 4 inches are still possible across Victoria and Calhoun counties through Tuesday morning, where a flash flood watch remains in effect.
- Still Forecasting Major Flooding on Guadalupe River & Coleto Creeks.





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
- Cloudy skies today with High temperatures in the lower 80s.
- Best chance of rain east of a Rockport to Goliad line tonight through Tuesday Morning.
- Northwest to west winds gusting 30 to 40 mph.




Streaks of light to moderate rain were occurring east of a Cuero to Corpus Christi line.

Forecast Rainfall Totals thru Wednesday



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
- Rainfall totals of 2 to 4", through Tuesday across Calhoun and Victoria counties.

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Flash flooding threat still possible for Victoria area through Tuesday Morning.


The colored symbols represent the latest forecast river level (not current river level)

Moderate Flooding Expected

- □ Moderate flooding expected.
- Second crest near 23.5 feet by Tonight
- At 24 ft., significant crop loss occurs. Areas of pastureland and cattle are cut off. Numerous primary and secondary roads and bridges flood, including the east approach to the Highway 59 access road bridge.


- Major flooding expected
- Crest around 31.5 feet starting late Wednesday/early Thursday.
- At 31 ft, 40 square block of Greens Addition Subdivision are generally flooded. Areas west of Moody Street between Water Street and **Constitution Street flood and access** may be limited, including homes near Club Westerner. Much of the flood plain below the confluence is flooded several miles wide.


Major flooding expected

- Continue rising to near 30 feet Friday. Higher rises possible!
- At 28 ft, water approaches the levees near the San Antonio River confluence. Miles of Highway 35 and the flood plain near it flood, cutting off many homes and flooding a fishing camp near Tivoli. Livestock are cut off and may drown.



Coleto Creek at Arnold Road Crossing

Major Flooding Expected




- Major flooding expected again Tuesday.
- Second crest around 17.6 feet late Tuesday.
- At 17 feet, livestock are cut off. Roads and bridges near the river are flooded and dangerous



Coleto Creek at Highway 59

Minor Flooding Expected



- Minor flooding expected (based on anticipated releases from Coleto Creek <u>AND</u> basin rainfall)
- □ Crest near 25 feet Wednesday
- At 25 ft, Camino Drive is inundated. Livestock below
 Highway 59 to the Guadalupe
 River confluence are cut off.



- Crest around 16.3 feet starting this morning.
- At 17 feet, the river is 200 yards wide at the Farm to Market 774 bridge.
